<i>Pseudoroegneria spicata</i>	bluebunch wheatgrass

Why Plugs?

- Plugs means less plastic in the world: You'll pop them directly from the trays - you get the plants, we keep the trays.
- Plugs transplant well and establish quicker (if cared for and well placed, of course).
- Plugs are ecologically sound: Planting more of one species is better for the plants and the pollinators.
- Plugs are easy and quick to plant.
